


25th Avenue Grade Separation Project UPCOMING DRIVEWAY RECONSTRUCTION

Dear Caltrain Neighbor,

As San Mateo's 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project progresses toward its goals to improve safety, and reduce traffic congestion and train horn noise, there will be upcoming construction impact we wish to make you aware of:

DRIVEWAY RECONSTRUCTION

At night on June 10 and June 11, from 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., the driveway to 110 E. 25th Avenue will be closed for reconstruction. During this time, vehicles will still be able to access the alley and parking lot from the Palm Place driveway. Businesses at E. 25th Avenue will remain open during construction.



The project anticipates two shifts of follow-up work will need to occur to complete the driveway. Dates will be communicated as soon as possible and access will be maintained. Please note unintended schedule changes do occur, and we thank you in advance for your patience. These activities will bring the project one step closer to creating the long-awaited east-west connections for pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles in San Mateo.
