

25th Avenue Grade Separation Project UPCOMING EL CAMINO REAL LANE CLOSURES & STOP SIGN

Dear Caltrain Neighbor,

As San Mateo's 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project progresses toward its goals to improve safety, and reduce traffic congestion and train horn noise, there will be traffic pattern changes due to construction we wish to make you aware of:

EL CAMINO REAL LANE CLOSURES (between Hillsdale Boulevard and 31st Avenue)

At night on June 1 to June 11, from 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m., there will be intermittent lane closures on El Camino Real between Hillsdale Boulevard and 31st Avenue. Bi-directional traffic will be allowed, with flaggers and signage. Crews will trench across the road to install a traffic signal conduit. Please note:

- The eastern sidewalk at 31st Avenue is currently closed to pedestrians; and during one or more nights the western sidewalk at 31st Avenue may be impacted at which time flaggers will assist any pedestrians through the intersection.
- If vehicles cannot turn onto El Camino Real due to a temporary lane closure, detours and signage will be available.

Starting on June 13 at 9:00 p.m. until June 14 at 3:00 p.m., there will be stop signs at the intersection of El Camino Real and 31st Avenue while crews work on the traffic signal power.



Please note unintended schedule changes do occur, and we thank you in advance for your patience. These activities will bring the project one step closer to creating the long-awaited east-west connections for pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles in San Mateo.
