

# FRONT DOOR ACCESS IMPACT TO RESIDENCE & SIDEWALK CLOSURE

Dear Caltrain Neighbor,

As San Mateo's 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project progresses toward its goals to improve safety, and reduce traffic congestion and train horn noise, there is an upcoming construction impact we wish to make you aware of:

### Sidewalk Closure & Front Access to Residence Impact

#### Phase I: Franklin Parkway to Lopez Drive

- Impact: Sidewalk closed, no front door access, no daytime street parking. Access will remain through Mena Drive.
- Dates: Starting Jan. 18, 2021 for approximately 1.5 months

#### Phase II: Lopez Drive to Pacific Boulevard

- Sidewalk closed, no front door access, no daytime street parking. Private driveway access remains.
- Dates: Will occur after Phase I, approximately March 2021 for 1.5 months.



Work hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Construction activities include removing the sidewalk (includes saw cutting); excavating; installing the storm drain pipe and drainage inlets; making connections to the existing manholes located on S. Delaware; and restoring the road and walkway. There will also be street parking restrictions and one-lane traffic closures on S. Delaware. Two neighborhood meetings (June 2018, January 2019) were previously held regarding this work and more project information can be found at www.caltrain.com/25thGS.

Please note unintended schedule changes do occur, and we thank you in advance for your patience. These activities will bring the project one step closer to creating the long-awaited east-west connections for pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles in San Mateo.
