Objectives

To understand for Go Pass companies:

- 1. The impact of COVID-19 on employee work location
- 2. Plans for Post Shelter-in-Place
- 3. Attitudes towards riding public/shared transit



Methodology

- Online survey distributed to all Go Pass companies
- Survey open between May 11 and May 26
- One response per company
- 102 out of 121 Go Pass companies responded (84%)
 - Including 9 of the top ten companies by revenue





What is the approximate number of employees at your company worksite (s) participating in the Go Pass Program?






Current Employee Work Location

What is the approximate percentage of employees currently telecommuting, coming into work or doing both?






Prior to COVID-19 Employee Work Location

Prior to COVID-19 13% of employees telecommuting only


What is the approximate percentage of employees, prior to COVID-19, telecommuting, coming into work or doing both?

 Current vs. Pre-COVID-19






Planning for Post-Shelter-in-Place

Has your company started planning for how employees will return to work when the Shelter-in-Place orders begin to be lifted?



Employees Returning to the Work Place

Gradual return of employees most likely to be implemented

What approach will your company suggest to employees for returning to the workplace when the Shelter-in-Place orders begin to lift?





Company Planning for Employee Return

- Company plans include some of the following elements:
 - Limited number of employees to return at each phase (21% of companies)
 - Employees to determine for themselves when they will return (16%)
 - Return date will be determined following County guidelines (7%)
 - Return dates of between June and September (17%), though most do not mention a return-to-work date (83%)
 - All employees to work from home permanently (3%)
- Almost 30% of companies are still working on their plan or don't have a timeline yet




Plans for Permanent Telecommuting

Is your company considering more permanent expanded telecommuting options?


