

# Storm Drain Installation SIDEWALK CLOSURE

(Between 31st Avenue and Pacific Boulevard)


Dear Caltrain Neighbor,

As San Mateo's 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project progresses toward its goals to improve safety, and reduce traffic congestion and train horn noise, there is an upcoming construction impact we wish to make you aware of:

# Sidewalk Closure: Starting January 18, 2021

Beginning January 18, 2021, there will be a phased closure of the eastern sidewalk on S. Delaware Street between 31st Avenue and Pacific Boulevard (see map):

- Phase I: Franklin Parkway to Lopez Drive January 18 for approximately 1.5 months
- Phase II: Lopez Drive to Pacific Boulevard Occurs directly after Phase I for approximately 1.5 months



A pedestrian detour will be available (see above map) with clear signage.

#### **Construction Information**

Work hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Construction activities include removing the sidewalk (includes saw cutting); excavating; installing the storm drain pipe and drainage inlets; making connections to the existing manholes; and restoring the walkway. There will also be daytime street parking restrictions on S. Delaware Street.

Please note unintended schedule changes do occur, and we thank you in advance for your patience. These activities will bring the project one step closer to creating the long-awaited east-west connections for pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles in San Mateo.

### **About the 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project**

Caltrain, in cooperation with the City of San Mateo, is improving safety, traffic flow, and reducing train horn noise in the City. The project will separate the railroad tracks from the road at E. 25th Avenue, create two new east-west connections at 28th and 31st Avenues, and build a new Hillsdale Station with updated amenities to better serve the community.
