


Storm Drain Installation Temporary Construction Staging (Lot at McIellan Ave. and Pacific Blvd. / S. Delaware St.)

Dear Caltrain Neighbor,

As San Mateo's 25th Avenue Grade Separation Project progresses toward its goals to improve safety, and reduce traffic congestion and train horn noise, there is a temporary construction impact we wish to make you aware of:

Temporary Construction Staging: January 2021

Construction to install a storm drain for the grade separation project began on January 18, 2021, including the temporary storage and staging of construction equipment at the lot at Mclellan Avenue and Pacific Boulevard/S. Delaware Street. The contractors are working on solutions in conversation with the project owners to move the storage and staging operation.



Construction Information

Work hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Construction activities for the storm drain include removing the sidewalk (includes saw cutting); excavating; installing the storm drain pipe and drainage inlets; making connections to the existing manholes; and restoring the walkway. There will also be daytime street parking restrictions on S. Delaware Street.

Please note unintended schedule changes do occur, and we thank you in advance for your patience. These activities will bring the project one step closer to creating the long-awaited east-west connections for pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles in San Mateo.

Caltrain, in cooperation with the City of San Mateo, is improving safety, traffic flow, and reducing train horn noise in the City. The project will separate the railroad tracks from the road at E. 25th Avenue, create two new east-west connections at 28th and 31st Avenues, and build a new Hillsdale Station with updated amenities to better serve the community.
