



BACKGROUND

- JPB meetings are subject to the Brown Act:
 - Guarantees the public's right to attend and participate in meetings of local legislative bodies
 - Permits governing bodies to adopt codes of conduct to preserve decorum and permit the orderly conduct of inperson meetings and meetings held via teleconference



CONDUCT AT PUBLIC MEETINGS

- Must permit public criticism of the agenda to be freely expressed at Board and Committee meetings
- May decline to take public comment on topics that are not within the subject matter jurisdiction of the agency
- May remove disruptive individuals from meetings in order to preserve order in a meeting



PROPOSED CODE OF CONDUCT

- Establish expectations for conduct at meetings in order to promote productivity and efficiency while fostering public participation
- Provide guidance and rules for public comment
- Authorize Chair to sanction speaker(s) if conduct:
 - Disrupts orderly conduct of a meeting or
 - Interferes with the Board's ability to conduct its business
- Remain consistent with Brown Act requirements
