The City of Millbrae Public Review Draft General Plan and Downtown and El Camino Real Specific Plan have been released. The comment period will be open until August 29, 2022. We anticipate releasing the Draft Program Environmental Impact Report in the summer and will provide a separate Notice of Availability for that document.

The Millbrae 2040 General Plan is a long-range plan that guides decision- making and establishes rules and standards for new development and city improvements. It reflects the community vision for the future and is intended to provide direction through the year 2040.

The Downtown and El Camino Real Specific Plan establishes a vision for the downtown district and the El Camino Real corridor, providing overarching policy framework and design standards in order to achieve that vision.
