



Fleet Disposition Project – Overview

Caltrain will complete PCEP and replace the 1985 – 1987 gallery cars and diesel locomotives with Stadler EMU trainsets in September 2024.

 Step one of fleet replacement is formal disposition of equipment no longer in revenue service.

- 34 Nippon-Sharyo gallery cars and 2 General Motors
 - EMD F40 diesel locomotives are ready for immediate disposition.



Fleet Disposition Project – By the Numbers

Caltrain has **93** gallery cars and **20** diesel locomotives that will be retired as a result of PCEP completion.

- Tranche 1: 34 gallery cars and 2 diesel locomotives currently stored in San Francisco, not in revenue service.
- Tranche 2: 59 gallery cars and 18 diesel locomotives currently in revenue service, to be replaced by EMUs.
- **41** Bombardier passenger cars and **9** diesel locomotives will remain post-PCEP for Gilroy service and fleet resiliency.





Fleet Disposition Project – Parallel Processes

 Authorization: today's Board action to authorize disposal of 34 gallery cars and 2 diesel locomotives.

 Transport and Storage: near-term relocation of surplus gallery cars and diesel locomotives prior to disposal, creating EMU storage space in San Francisco.

 Solicitation: post-authorization, JPB staff will prepare a solicitation and sell the surplus equipment.





Fleet Disposition Project – Solicitation

JPB Procurement Policy provides four methods of disposition for surplus or scrap items:

- 1. Transfer or sale to other public agencies
- 2. Trade-in as part of a new procurement
- 3. Sale by auction, advertisement for sealed bids, or negotiation
- 4. Recycling, disposal, or donation to a non-profit entity

The sealed bid method is preferred as it "typically brings the highest cash return to the public agency," according to the State of California.

Fleet Disposition Project – Today's Action

"...the Board of Directors of the Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board hereby authorizes the Executive Director or designee to dispose of thirty-four surplus Nippon Sharyo passenger gallery cars and two surplus General Motors-EMD F40 diesel locomotives in accordance with the JPB's Procurement Policy."
