Staff Request of AMP Committee

- Recommend that the Board:
 - Award a contract to ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. of Reston, Virginia to provide the Services for the Project for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$21,101,357 for a three-year base term, with up to two additional one-year option terms for up to \$1 million per option year.
 - Authorize the Executive Director or designee to execute a contract with ICF in full conformity with the terms and conditions of the solicitation documents and negotiated agreements, and in a form approved by legal counsel.
 - Authorize the Executive Director or designee, to exercise up to two additional one-year option terms, if deemed in the best interest of the JPB.

Scope of Services

- Prepare Alternatives Analysis Report (summarization of the Alternatives Development)
- Share designs with 3rd parties and obtain comments
- Develop Project Description
- Prepare needed engineering/ design/ required technical studies
- Conduct public participation and community engagement
- Issue Notice of Intent / Notice to Proceed
- Prepare and circulate Admin Draft, Draft EIS/EIR
- Prepare Response to comments and Final EIS/EIR and circulate
- Obtain Certification and Record of Decision



Solicitation Process

- RFP released January 29, 2025, on PlanetBids (eProcurement Website)
- Outreached to DBEs and SBEs
- Pre-Proposal Conference: February 13, 2025
- Three consultants and 12 subconsultants attended the Pre-Proposal Conference
- Received two proposals
- Staff determined both proposals are responsive to the RFP requirements

Solicitation Process (Cont.)

- Selection Committee: JPB Planning Department, California High Speed Rail Authority (CHSRA), City of San Jose, Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), and Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA)
- The Committee reviewed, evaluated, and scored both proposals, and determined that the proposal from ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. of Reston, Virginia was the highest ranked
- Following the interview, the Committee determined that ICF possesses the requisite experience and qualifications required for the successful performance of the scope of services as defined in the solicitation documents



Price Analysis

Staff conducted a price analysis and determined the negotiated prices to be fair, reasonable, and consistent with the prices currently paid by the JPB and other public agencies in the Bay Area for similar services
