### **Federal**

### **Appropriations**

- On Nov 12, longest federal government shutdown ended.
- New CR funding expires Jan 30
- Senate discussing funding package that could include THUD bill.
- Caltrain is awaiting approval for its federal formula grant agreement for new electric trains replacement vehicles

### **Surface Transportation Reauthorization**

- Process delayed by shutdown.
- House T&I expected to release bill in first quarter of 2026



## **Federal**

### **Proposed Transit Funding Cuts**

- US DOT submitted two proposals to cut transit funding:
  - Proposal 1: eliminate the mass transit portion of the Highway Trust Fund and reallocate the money to road projects.
  - Proposal 2: eliminate the Federal Highway Administration's eligibility to fund transit projects and prohibit states from using highway formula dollars for transit projects.
- APTA issued a statement
- House T&I Chair Graves has signaled this would likely not be part of the reauthorization bill
- These proposals would require legislative action



# State Legislative Session

### Legislative Schedule

- Oct 31: State Transit Transformation Task Force report due (Not yet been submitted)
- Jan 1: Bills go into effect
- Jan 5: Legislative Session reconvenes
- Jan 10: Deadline for State loan negotiation process to be finished
- Jan 10: Governor Budget submission
- Jan 31: Last day for each house to pass bills introduced in that house in 2025
- Feb 20: Last day for bills to be introduced



# State Loan for Bay Area Transit

### **State Bridge Loan for Bay Area Transit Agencies**

- Caltrain meeting with DOF Dec 2
- Caltrain deficit in FY 27 is approaching \$60M
- Negotiation process to be finished by Jan 10, 2026



# SB 63 Efficiency Review

### **Efficiency Review Requirement**

- Financial efficiency review required by Caltrain, BART, Muni, AC Transit
- Led by MTC with third-party consultant and oversight committee
- Phase 1 (by Apr 1, 2026):
  - Document cost savings since 2020
  - Identify "early action" service & customer improvements
  - Inventory real property & redevelopment opportunities near stations
  - Caltrain must adopt selected strategies by Jul 1, 2026
- Phase 2 (after voter approval):
  - Analyze broader cost-savings (capital, operating, admin)
  - Use metrics: cost & subsidy per passenger-mile
  - Regional real property strategy (development, financing, ridership impacts)
  - Draft implementation plan (120 days) → Final plan required (Board Action)



# Draft 2026 Legislative Program: Major Issues

#### Funding

- Funding for transit operations and capital needs
- Cap-and-Invest-related funding
- Potential funding measures

#### Project and Program Implementation

- Equitable transportation and mobility solutions
- Transit-oriented development and transit demand management
- Caltrain Service Vision, connectivity and blended system

#### Legislative and Regulatory Actions

- PEPRA
- CARB regulations and programs and CEQA modernization
- Procurement



# Cap-and-Invest Program

- Work to secure additional Cap-and-Invest funding to support operations and capital needs and protect existing Cap-and-Invest appropriations for transit.
- Work to ensure that any Cap-and-Invest High-Speed Rail bookend funding prioritizes projects that:
  - Promote corridor safety by advancing near-term crossing safety enhancements;
  - Enhance local mobility and safety with the delivery of grade separations;
  - Increase ridership, access, connectivity and passenger experience;
  - Strengthen corridor reliability and improves system performance;
  - Support regional and state sustainability goals;
  - · Prioritize feasible, shovel-ready projects with clear path to progress and implementation.

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
